
- 28 Multi-Donor Trust Funds and 13 Country-Level Joint Programmes

- 74 countries of operation
















PBF Second Annual Progress Report

MDTF Office Consolidated Narrative and Financial Progress Reports

- Based on reports and data provided by Recipient UN Organizations
- Enables assessment of projects and/or agencies' performance
- Attempts to analyze how PBF Strategic Objectives are being met
- Lack of standard peacebuilding sectors across Priority Plans makes it difficult to make comparison across countries (Governance, Human Rights, Justice, Security Sector Reform, etc.)
- Finalized and submitted to PBF Donors in July 2009

MDTF Reporting Portal

- MDTF Office administers 28 MDTFs, reports from 42 PUNOs in 74 countries;
- Challenge to manually consolidate and maintain high reporting standards;
- Portal replaces manual processes with user-friendly online reporting system;
- All MDTF stakeholders will be able to view narrative/financial reports and related data for their specific MDTF;
- Separate (from UNDP) MDTF General Ledger Business Unit established in April 2009

Administrative Agent fee:

\$2.91 million (1% deducted at time of deposit)

Direct Costs (Steering Committees Support Offices, PBSO, Advisory Group):

\$9.28 million (3% of total deposits)

- \$1.86 million in 2008 (5.3% of total programme cost)


PBF Expenditure Data (as of 31 Dec 2008)

Financial implementation rates as per PBF Annual Progress Report 2008:

Burundi:	17 projects	\$20.9m (64%)
• Sierra Leone:	14 projects	\$17.5m (53%)
Liberia:	8 projects	\$ 0.7m (14%)
• Guinea Bissau:	4 projects	\$ 2.2m (39%)
• Cote d'Ivoire:	2 projects	\$ 3.0m (61%)

Fund Administration: Preliminary Lessons Learned

Clarity on who can receive PBF Funding

- Eligibility ambiguous in PBF Terms of Reference
- Eligibility of UN Secretariat entities

Steering Committee and Support Secretariat

- Early establishment of Support Secretariat to ensure effective and proficient administrative and programme review support
 Key leadership role of both UN (SRSG/ERSG/RC) and National Authorities
- Composition Steering Committees (size & level)
- Ensure Steering Committee members and Secretariat staff are fully abreast on PBF procedures through joint PBSO/MDTF-O guidance


Improving measurement of performance

- Need to strengthen oversight and monitoring of PBF operations at global level
- Need to strengthen capacity for results-based programming and reporting
- Procedural arrangement in place to ensure timely submission of quarterly updates

PBF building on existing funding mechanisms

PBF contribution to Nepal through UN Peace Fund for Nepal's existing governance arrangements and support mechanisms, and recently through the DRC Stabilization Fund
